Teaching School Hubs

In the DfE's Recruitment and Retention strategy, published in January 2019, they committed to improving their support for teachers, ensuring that they receive high quality training and development at every stage of their career – from Initial Teacher Training (ITT) through to leadership qualifications.

Central to this programme are the ITT Core Content and Early Career Framework, which set out an entitlement to new, evidence-based support and training over the first three years of a teacher's career, as well as support for their mentors. The DfE

have also developed a reformed suite of National Professional Qualifications.

At the heart of this new system will be **teaching school hubs** who will work with partners in their region to deliver the governments ambition. The central focus for teaching school hubs will be teacher and leader development.

We expect the Lincolnshire Teaching School Hub to be announced in late January.



Mobilise - The Next Chapter

We're extremely proud of the role Mobilise has played in developing the county's evidence-informed and collaborative approach to professional development since 2016. Without the support of LLP and the engagement and contribution of so many schools across the county, we would not have arrived at this point, where Mobilise was described by a Headteacher as **'a powerful game-changer'**. We're very excited about the new projects and the continued partnerships of local services and agencies that will support Mobilise in bringing robust evidence and quality resources into Lincolnshire's schools.

Our final Mobilise 4 PLCs conclude this week; we would like to thank all of the Cluster Leads who have facilitated their meetings so superbly, both face-to-face and virtually, throughout 2020. Schools' commitment to school improvement through evidence-informed practice, has never been stronger. School-based Leads have utilised and embraced collaborative cluster partnerships, wider working and support from county agencies and services, shadow PLCs, Mobilise supporting resources and additional CPD opportunities, to maximise the impact of their projects.

Special Schools Project - Workforce Development



Many thanks to those colleagues who have supported this workstream to date.

The proposal has now been signed off and we have made contact with all specialist schools and relevant professionals, to start to build the content for the first phase. This will focus on what our specialist schools need for staff readiness and development, as they begin to open as all needs provision.

The project is being co-ordinated on behalf of the SEN Alliance (Special schools project Board) by Lea Mason,

working with colleagues from Lincolnshire's current SEND teaching schools, Inspire and Learn.

As planned the platform will be accessed via the LCSB. Phase two will then be developed and broadened to allow other settings, parents and carers to access. This is a fantastic way to share the wealth of expertise and knowledge we have within Lincolnshire and as the project broadens over the coming 2 years.

The presentations cover the following topics:

- Governance in a Covid-19 context: Recovery and Resilience - a resource to support the Governing Boards of Lincolnshire schools with considering,

in depth, the implications for their work of the context of the pandemic.

- Support Tools for Self / Peer Review – a resource to support Governing Boards in making effective use of the tool
- Development Needs Audit Tool – a simple and straightforward review tool for Governing Boards to determine appropriate areas of development focus
